Educational Adviser

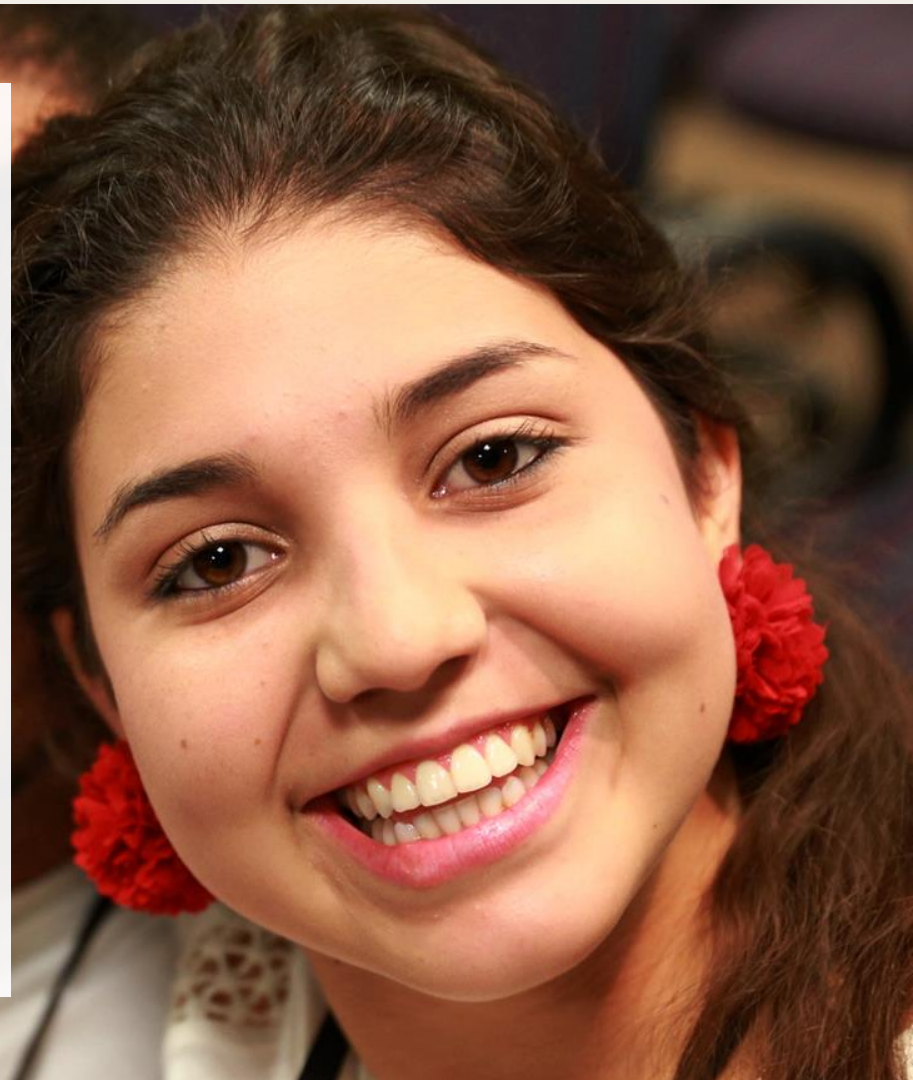
The educational adviser's role includes:

- Helping connect to mentors, internships, and fellowship opportunities.
- Creating academic support plans.
- Supporting career planning and/or the graduate school application process.

Cooke Scholars attend colleges and universities spanning the country and globe.

Each year, the Foundation hosts a Scholars Weekend event attended by approximately 300 Cooke Scholars.

Eligibility

- No previous full-time enrollment at a four-year institution
- Sophomore status by Jan. 1 2021 at a two-year institution, or a recent graduate (since spring 2016).
- Enrolling in a four-year college in fall of 2021.
- Cumulative unweighted GPA of 3.5 or above.
- Demonstrate unmet financial need.

Undergraduate Transfer Scholarship for Community College Students

The Jack Kent Cooke Foundation Undergraduate Transfer Scholarship makes it possible for the nation's top **community college students** to complete their bachelor's degrees by transferring to a selective four-year college or university. The Foundation provides up to \$40,000 per year to each scholarship recipient selected, making it the largest private scholarship for two-year and community college transfer students in the country.

To be eligible for the Jack Kent Cooke Foundation Undergraduate Transfer Scholarship, applicants must meet the following eligibility requirements:

- **No previous enrollment or attendance at a four-year institution** - Students who have enrolled full-time at a four-year institution in the past are not eligible for this scholarship.
- **Sophomore Status at a Community College** - Be a current student at an accredited U.S. community college or two-year institution with sophomore status by January 1, 2020, or a recent graduate (since spring 2015).
- **Full College Enrollment** - Plan to enroll full-time in a baccalaureate program at an accredited college or university in **fall 2020**.
- **GPA** - Have a cumulative undergraduate grade point average of 3.50 or better on a 4.0 scale (or the equivalent).
