Grade level: Currently in 7th grade and/or entering 8th grade in the fall of 2021.

Academics: Earned all As and Bs in core academic subjects since beginning of 6th grade.

Income: Demonstrate unmet financial need with a maximum adjusted gross income of \$95,000.

Location: Permanently reside in the United States and plan to attend high school in the U.S.

This cohort of Young Scholars includes district, regional, and state robotics, music, math, and spelling bee champions (with one headed to Scripps!), a first-place winner for a Panasonic Eco Student Citizenship Project, and a recipient of a president's volunteer service award. One finalist is a reporter for Scholastic Kids Press and another was chosen to present to her congressperson on behalf of her school about climate change.

These Scholars are already taking accelerated courses in STEM, humanities, and languages, grade levels above their peers.
