

# WHAT IS THE COOKE YOUNG SCHOLARS PROGRAM?

## AN OVERVIEW FOR PARENTS AND FAMILIES

The **Jack Kent Cooke Foundation** is dedicated to advancing the education of exceptionally promising students who have financial need. Since 2000, the Foundation has awarded \$332 million in scholarships to nearly 3,900 students from 8th grade through graduate school, along with comprehensive educational advising, career counseling, and other support services.

The **Cooke Young Scholars Program** is a selective five-year, pre-college scholarship for high-performing 7th grade students with financial need. Cooke Educational Advisers help Young Scholars maximize the high school experience and prepare to thrive at the nation's top colleges.

Our **programming and support** include:

- »> Identifying an appropriately rigorous high school
- »> Engaging in four-year planning and goal setting
- »> Funding for academic and extracurricular opportunities, such as music and art lessons; supplemental academic classes; and technology
- »> Annual summer programs, plus two required Cooke Young Scholar events
- »> Year-round interaction and networking with a community of high-achieving peers



## ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Cooke Young Scholars demonstrate exceptional academic abilities, unique talents, genuine curiosity, and persistence to achieve goals. Applicants must meet the following eligibility requirements:

- »> **Grade level:** Currently in 7th grade and/or entering 8th grade in the fall.
- »> **Academics:** Since the beginning of the 6th grade, have earned grades of all or mostly As, with no Cs or below in core academic subjects.
- »> **Financial Need:** Demonstrate unmet financial need. Applicants with a family adjusted gross income (AGI) up to \$95,000 are eligible to apply.
- »> **Location:** Currently attending middle school in the U.S. and planning to attend high school in the U.S.

## APPLICATION OVERVIEW

- » Applicant and family information
- » Academics, activities, and awards
- » Three short answer prompts and one long essay
- » Two academic recommendations
